- *pea* small round green vegetable (Erbse)
- *greates* = *grits* Grütze
- vinegar ['vɪnɪgə] sharptasting liquid made from wine, used for salad dressing
- mustard seed ['mʌstəd]
   Senfkörner
- stocking one of a pair of pieces of clothing worn on the feet and legs
- course cloth = coarse cloth [kbis] cloth made for sails
- hatchet light, shorthandled axe
- howe = hoe ['həu] longhandled garden tool used for turning the soil
- wimble, piercer bit ['prəsə] tools for boring holes
- occupation job
